
CONTINUE A KC LEGACY

John Jordan "Buck" O'Neil was a baseball player and manager for the Kansas City Monarchs from 1938 to 1955. He later became the first African-American coach in Major League Baseball. O'Neil helped establish the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum in 1990 and served as board chairman until his death in 2006.

In 2016, on the 10th anniversary of his death, the Broadway Bridge was renamed in his honor. During the dedication ceremony, Mamie Hughes, one of the first members of Freedom, Inc., former Jackson County Legislator, and friend of Buck was quoted, "He gave himself to building bridges among people, the renaming of the Broadway Bridge to the John Jordan "Buck" O'Neil is tremendous."




